New Delhi YMCA celebrated YMCA Founders Day with Thanksgiving Prayer Fellowship in the Heinz Auditorium, Tourist Hostel, Jai Singh Road on 6th June 2022. The General Secretary & CEO, Mr. Mark Clive in his opening remarks shared a brief history, purpose and objective of the YMCA Mission. He further shared the programmes and activities conducted by New Delhi YMCA. The Global YMCA movement began in 1844 in London with a primary focus of providing "a home away from home", and for improving spiritual and human needs of young men engaged in drapery and other trades during the industrial revolution in England, which forced thousands abandoning the countryside for a better living in city. India saw the beginning of the YMCA during 1854 in Kolkata, the then capital of India. The "Red Inverted Triangle", the symbol of YMCA, portrays YMCA's ethos of service in the development of the body, mind and spirit.

Mr. Felix Fernandes, President in his address emphasized on YMCA Mission and its commitment towards the development of the youth and the community at large, irrespective of cast, colour, religion and gender. The New Delhi YMCA founded in 1927, is essentially concerned with the needs, dreams and aspirations of young people for their social, intellectual, spiritual and physical development. The President in his address highlighted the programmes & activities viz; Social and Human Development, Dalit and Tribal issue related programmes, Senior Secondary School level education, Education and Training for special children, Care of the aged, imparting quality professional education and professional skill training, Promotion of camping, sports coaching and fitness, providing hospitality services and management development programmes, Culture, youth and Christian emphasis related programmes for the furtherance of NDY Mission.

The National Youth Assembly 2022 hosted by the New Delhi YMCA was held at the beautiful YMCA Campsite Sattal, Uttarakhand from 20th to 23rd May 2022 under the aegis of the National Council of YMCAs of India. 94 young people from across the country participated. "Ignite, The Call to Commitment" was the theme for the assembly. After a brief orientation by Mr. Koshy Vaidyan Secretary, Youth Work, Mr. Noel Phillips, Associate General Secretary, New Delhi YMCA and Mr. Bhen Samson, Camp Director the assembly started with the affirmation of the Paris Basis by Ms. Mahima Agarwal. Opening prayer was said by Ms Pooja Jaiswal. Mr. Mark Clive the General Secretary & CEO of New Delhi YMCA welcomed the delegates and the guests for the Youth Assembly. President of the New Delhi YMCA Mr. Felix Fernandes addressed the august body and inaugurated the assembly along with few Office Bearers of the Board of Directors of the New Delhi YMCA. This was followed by honoring of the guests by Mr. Mark Medley on behalf of the National Council of YMCAs of India. Mr. Koshy Vaidyan, Secretary, Youth Work, NCYI addressed the gathering. The inaugural session concluded with vote of thanks proposed by Mr. Noel Phillips and a closing prayer offered by Mr. Aryan Singh from YMCA Nagpur.

The keynote address on the theme of the assembly was delivered by Mr. Mark Medley, Principal of St. Andrews Public School, Bhowali, and Chairman of the YMCA Youth Centre, Bhimtal. Mr. Bhen Samson conducted ice-breaking sessions with some active group games. After dinner, the delegates enjoyed an evening of Masihi Qawwali by Mr. Sunny Samson from Faridabad.

The second day began with morning Sattal tea and some physical jerks led by Ms. Mahima from New Bedaghat YMCA. Morning devotion at the open chapel was led by Mr. Vineet Masih, Senior Secretary, New Delhi YMCA. The first session was taken by Mr. Sunder Singh, Secretary, NCYI on "Know your YMCA" with a brief history of pioneering leaders of the YMCA's beginnings and how young people can be involved in the YMCA. It was time for a day trip to the beautiful lake town of Nainital organized by the New Delhi YMCA. 

New Delhi YMCA Department of Social and Human Development "Free Eye Camp" on 17th & 19th May 2022




