The Department of Program, Cultural, & Tribal; organized a Free Medical Camp for NDY Staff on 30th January 2024 at the Greater Noida Programme Centre, Greater Noida, UP. The Medical Camp began with a word of prayer by Mr. Ashish Clifton, Secretary, NDY, This initiative was aimed at emphasizing and ensuring the social and medical welfare of the NDY Community. A voluntary team of 10 Doctors and Medical Experts was deputed "ENTEGRITY" to examine and diagnose NDY personnel. They conducted elaborate procedures that included ENT check-ups and General Diagnosis followed by prescriptions and medical counseling. The annual science exhibition held at YMCA Public School, Nizamuddin East, was a captivating celebration of scientific exploration and creativity. Under the theme "Fun with Science," students and educators alike demonstrated a remarkable enthusiasm for learning and discovery. From live experiments to innovative working models, the event was brimming with excitement and ingenuity.

The exhibition was inaugurated by secretary Mr. Feroze Khan, Principal Mr. C. P. Davis, Coordinators Mrs. Sheena Subroi, Mrs. Namita Kakkar and Mrs. Alpana Poddar along with Trainee Secretary Mr. Mark Biswas. They visited the exhibition and observed all the students. Children explained their models enthusiastically. Every dignitary enjoyed and appreciated the efforts of the students. Students from the Primary, Middle, and Senior wing also visited the exhibition.

The students displayed their creative and scientific potential in diverse arenas revolving around the themes of Agriculture, Food Security, Sources of Energy and their Conservation, Transport, Communication, Disaster Management, Health, Robotics, and Engineering Sciences. Students were at their innovative best as they designed their own Automobile, Hover Craft, Motorboats, Metal Detectors, Echo Rangers, Rural Air Conditioners, and Earthquake Impact Detectors to unique designs for tapping alternative sources of energy and new ways to conserve the conventional ones. The event in itself ignited the scientific curiosity in children and gave them a platform to give concrete dimensions to their ideas, from the zone of imagination to realism.

The Social Science Department also participated in different types of displays. The Primary section displayed different types of Igloos and the lifestyle of Eskimos. They also explained about the Indian forest and its wildlife. Also, the Secondary section displayed the Jewellery and toys of Harappan culture and their living standard. On the other side, they also showed the different Stupas and the war of King Ashoka in Kalinga beautifully.

Maths Department also participated in different types of displays. The Primary Wing displayed various models of fractions, decimals, calendars, time, lines, and angles. They also displayed a working model of a Clock and explained the concept of time in detail. The middle school displayed the working model of square and square root, cubes and cube roots, algebraic identities, and triangles and explained the concepts well to the visitors.

The senior wing displayed the working model on Trigonometry triangles and algebraic Identities. The excitement of students during the exhibition was evident and they were able to analyze the importance of Maths in their daily life.
